

## Grayshott CE Primary School: Pupil Premium 2015 - 2016

### What is Pupil Premium?

Schools receive Pupil Premium funding from the government based on the number of pupils:

- Who are eligible for Free School Meals
- Who have been entitled to, or have received, Free School Meals within the last six years
- Whose parents are in the armed forces
- Who are in local authority care or have been for a period of six months or more in the last six years

The aim of this funding is to close the attainment gap between these pupils and other students. The school was allocated £19,808 of the Government Pupil Premium Grant in the financial year 2015/16.

### How do we use Pupil Premium?

The school uses this funding to provide targeted support and teaching for pupils who are at risk of not making progress. This includes the employment of two Emotional Literacy Support Assistants (ELSAs) who work with pupils to overcome emotional barriers to learning. The school also uses the Premium to pay for a Parent Support Advisor, in partnership with a cluster of local schools. The premium is used to target the purchase of resources and intervention time for individual children as appropriate.

### What was the impact of Pupil Premium?

Our data represents a small group of children, some of whom also have Special Educational Needs.
